Community and Leisure Facilities Committee Minutes

Held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 20th January 2014 at 7.30pm

Present: Cllrs Beckford, Collier, Morris, Mudd, Andy Ward, Alan Raven, Terry Keeble, David Munns

In attendance: 4 members of the public

- **15L/001. Chairman's Introduction and Apologies –** Cllrs Leeks and Young (work). Cllrs Berenger and Richards will arrive late following defibrillator training.
- 15L/002. Public participation Standing Orders to be suspended Simon Rose, Chair of Colts, spoke re. item 15L/011. For the past couple of years they have been struggling for pitch space in Cottenham. The CPS field is currently not available and this has compounded the situation. They don't want to incur fines from the FA for cancelling games. The Colts require continuity to enable them to make long term plans. Dave Partridge spoke regarding the knock-on effect of possible additional rugby provision on the cricket outfield.
- **15L/003. To accept Declarations of Interest** To receive disclosures of pecuniary and non-pecuniary interests from Councillors on matters to be considered at the meeting. Cllr Beckford declared a non-pecuniary interest in item 15L/010 (he is a member of the Renegades).
- **15L/004. Minutes** Amendment under Present: Partridge should read Munns. Resolution that the minutes of the Committee meeting held on the 15th December 2014 be signed as a correct record. **RESOLVED**.
- 15L/005. Reports
 - Clerk report circulated prior to the meeting. Have received notification that Cambridge Rambling Club will give us a grant towards the new gate between the 3rd field and Les King Wood to create a new circular walk (Need identified in the Vision Plan). Clerk to obtain quotes for mobility kissing gate. Clerk to contact Tree Warden (Cllr Bolitho) re. carrying out a survey of all PC-owned trees to ascertain their condition. Eastern Landscapes to be contacted regarding Village Green tree requiring follow-up picus test.
 - Playground safety report circulated prior to the meeting
- 15L/006. New skatepark To consider next steps following WREN decision Cllr Collier reported that a meeting had taken place onsite with Wheelscape. They have had a cancellation and could potentially begin work within the next couple of weeks which is several months ahead of expectation. Cllr Morris reported that there are still some technical issues to resolve including the location of an electric cable but this is being checked. The WREN offer is expected this week. We may be able to remove the fencing but this needs checking with Rospa (the advantage being that it will create further space). A track will be put along the side of the village hall. Originally planned to use track matting however if possible we will replace this with the installation of a sub-structure which can be utilised afterwards to provide disabled access and a cylepath. Some of the bund by the car park will have to be removed and a container sited for the duration of the road build.
- **15L/007.** Changing rooms To receive an update on the project Cllrs Morris stated further to the report submitted that following a meeting of all contractors, engineers, Wilby & Burnett and CPC representatives, Durman Stearn will begin onsite on 2nd February for 9 weeks, followed by CJ Murfitt for 21 weeks. Careful juggling will be required of the invoicing.
- **15L/008.** Rubbish bins To consider purchase of 2 replacement litter bins Clerk to obtain quotes.
- **15L/009.** Trees on village green To consider maintenance to remove epicormic growth from trees to the level of Christmas lights Clerk to obtain quotes. Tree Warden to be requested to do a survey of all CPC owned trees.

- 15L/010. Rugby To consider request from Renegades and Rascals for additional use of the Recreation Ground facilities A proposal was circulated prior to the meeting. The Clerk has since spoken to Stephen Conrad at County and during the conversation the possibility of a land swap was discussed (see 15L/018). This needs to be investigated further. Cllr Beckford ran through the proposal and stressed that the Renegades were looking for equal rights to the pitches. Concerning use of the existing changing rooms Cllr Morris pointed out that there was a cost consideration regarding the immersion heater which was very expensive to run. There is no issue re. kitchen sharing with the Colts. Suggestion that rugby/football/cricket reps get together with CPC to ascertain long-term requirements. Resolution that CALF recommends that the that Rascals be allowed non-exclusive use of the existing changing rooms and kitchen facilities until such time as the long term future of the building is decided (subject to suitable contract agreement). RESOLVED. NB: there will also be occasions when the new changing rooms are available for use by the Rascals.
- **15L/011. Colts** To consider request to accommodate further pitches at the Recreation Ground Cllrs Berenger and Richards arrived at 8.39pm. Standing Orders suspended at 8.40pm. Simon Rose gave an overview of the primary school field issues. The club would be happy to support the PC with draining improvements. They are governed by FA rules on pitch conditions. They would be willing to fundraise etc. to help. Standing Orders reinstated at 8.45pm. Clerk to contact CPS to ascertain when their pitches would be available again. Meeting arranged onsite with Colts for Saturday 24th January at 10am Cllrs Beckford and Richards to attend with groundsman.
- **15L/012. Risk assessment** To consider review of current procedures for storage of cleaning items at VH. Cllr Mudd confirmed that we are covered under our insurance policy. Cllr Beckford offered to donate a lockable storage box for the cleaning products which will be located in the alarm cupboard.
- **15L/013. PHS Contract** Resolution to sign revised contract for collection of sanitary bins. **RESOLVED**. NB: Signage needed in the ladies toilets accordingly.
- **15L/014. Morgan Sindall** Cllr Morris gave an overview of the report (previously circulated) following meeting with Laura Deadman.
- **15L/015. Allotment security** This item was covered under 15L/014.
- **15L/016.** Ladybirds fence This item was covered under 15L/014.
- **15L/017. Hire & partnership (user) agreements** Cllrs Morris & Mudd reported that the process of drafting the agreements was ongoing.
- 15L/018. Drainage issues on 3rd field, Rec Ground To consider seeking approval from County Farms as to whether CPC can arrange for a trench to be dug on County land to help with the drainage problems Cllr Mudd said that County haven't given a firm yes or no regarding putting in a trench. Clerk has spoken to them at length and they wouldn't be keen on land being taken out of production. Additionally any land would have to be put back to its original condition at the end of the tenancy. We still need to look at vertidraining with sand on the 2nd pitch once the weather is better. Defer item until further information obtained from County re. land swap options.
- 15L/019. Facilities Committee Terms of Reference To consider amendment to CALF terms of reference to include delegated expenditure authority for up to 10% per quarter of the annual budget on each of various specified maintenance and council-delegated projects (as per resolution 15/016 13th Jan 2015) Cllr Morris gave an overview. The additional clause will be under Section 7. Resolution that the CALF Terms of Reference are amended to include delegated expenditure authority for up to 10% per quarter of the annual budget on each of various specified maintenance and council-delegated projects. RESOLVED.
